Please give us some information on your general preferences concerning your crown and bridge restorations. The answers to these questions will be included on each lab worksheet and will help us determine how we may best be of service to you.

Margins and Dies

If while we are trimming the dies, do you prefer we:

- 1) call if we can't identify the margin
- 2) send back for die trim
- 3) trim as best we can and make a note

Occlusion & Prep

If we notice the bite is close and does not offer enough room for porcelain, do you prefer we:

- 1) call and ask if you wish to see it
- 2) relieve opposing and mark in red and include a note
- 3) relieve prep and mark in red and include a note
- 4) relieve prep and make reduction coping

How do you prefer your occlusion?

- 1) in firm occlusion on all cases
- 2) light occlusion on all cases
- 3) slightly out of occlusion in centric and excursive movements on all cases
- 4) completely out of occlusion

How do you prefer your contact areas?

- 1) broad and deep with firm finger pressure to seat
- 2) broad and deep with light finger pressure to seat
- 3) broad and deep with very light finger pressure to seat
- 4) slightly out of contact
- 5) open contours but point contact with firm finger pressure to seat
- 6) open contours but point contact with light finger pressure to seat
- 7) open contours but point contact with very light finger pressure to seat
- 8) use a solid model for contacts

Metal Bands, Thumbs and Porcelain margin areas.

- 1) thin metal bands on posteriors
- 2) thin metal bands on linguals
- 3) hidden "thumbs" on distal lingual (built into the contour for holding with hemo-stats)
- 4) no metal showing anywhere

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
